Background information

“[Poverty in Calderdale – selected statistics](#)” - also known as the Calderdale Anti-Poverty dashboards - is a collection of dashboards about poverty statistics for Calderdale. They have been developed alongside the Calderdale Anti-Poverty Action Plan to provide evidence of poverty in Calderdale. The plan is available at the Calderdale Council web page [Money and Wellbeing in Calderdale](#).

The dashboards were first published in 2019 and are updated every month with new information. Thirty-two data sets underpin the dashboards. Ward and LSOA* (Lower layer super output area) statistics are provided where that data is available. Twenty-seven of the data sets have dashboards showing recent trends.

The dashboards are published on the [Calderdale Dataworks open data website](#). The content is developed in consultation with the Calderdale Anti-Poverty steering group. The dashboards are maintained by Calderdale Council Performance and Business Intelligence Team.

* LSOAs are areas developed by the Office for National Statistics for reporting statistics of similar sized populations of about 1,700 people.

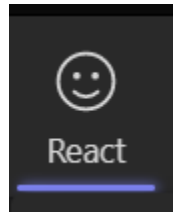

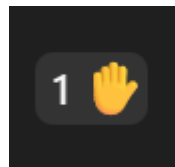
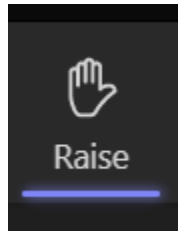

Guide screen (continued)

Tasks

1. Click on the “Guide” button in the top tool bar to go to the Guide screen.

The “Latest updates” table will show which data sets have been updated recently and when future updates are expected.

Place the mouse over the top right of the table.

The  symbol “Focus mode” will appear.

2. Click on the “Focus mode” symbol to view the information in the table in more detail.
3. Click on the symbol “Back to report” to return to the Guide screen
4. When you are ready click on “All” in the top tool bar and put your hand up in teams.

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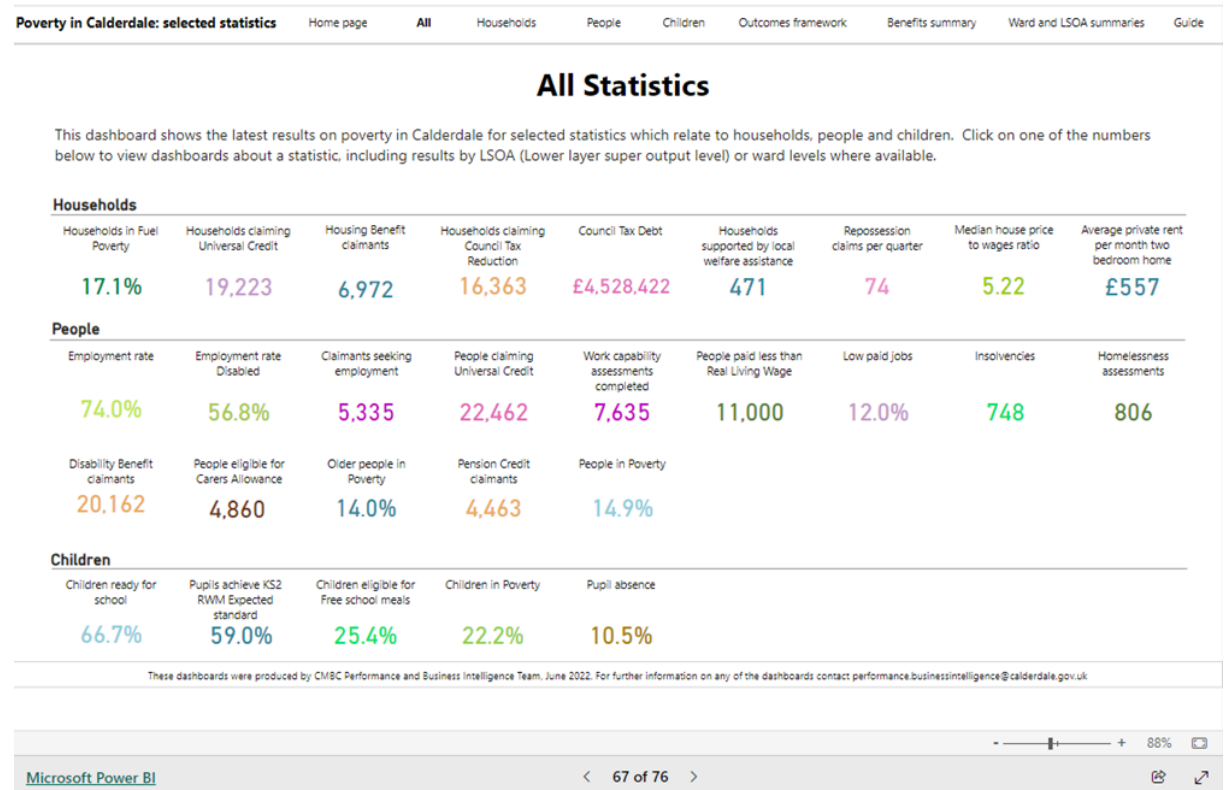

Tasks

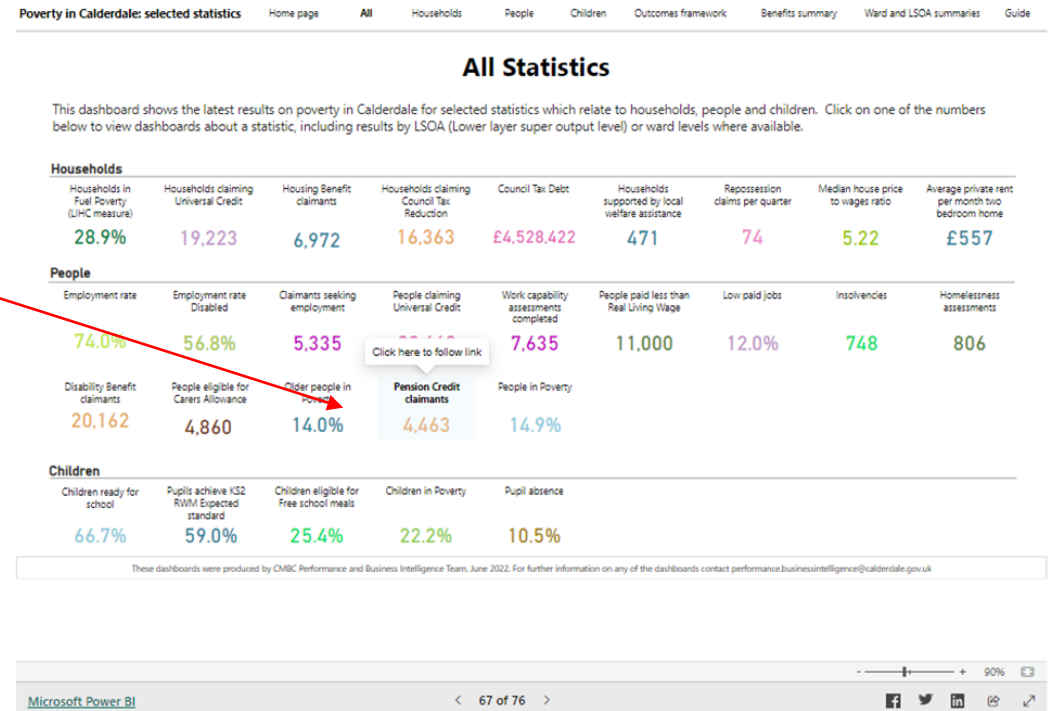
1. Click on one of the numbers to view one or more dashboards about that data set or category.
2. Click on “All” in the top tool bar to get back to this screen.
3. Repeat with different data sets.
4. When you are ready click on “All” in the top tool bar.

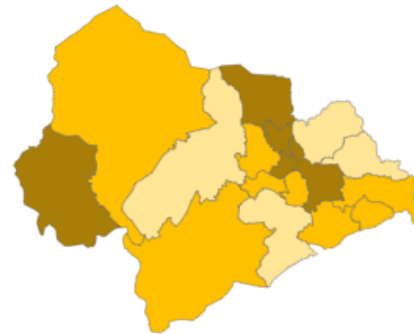

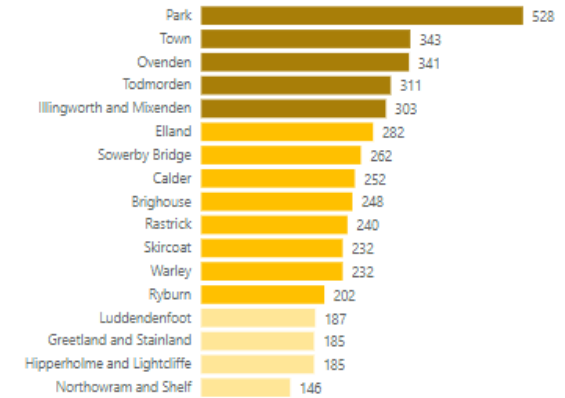


Number of pension credit claimants: by ward: map

Example ward dashboard (continued)

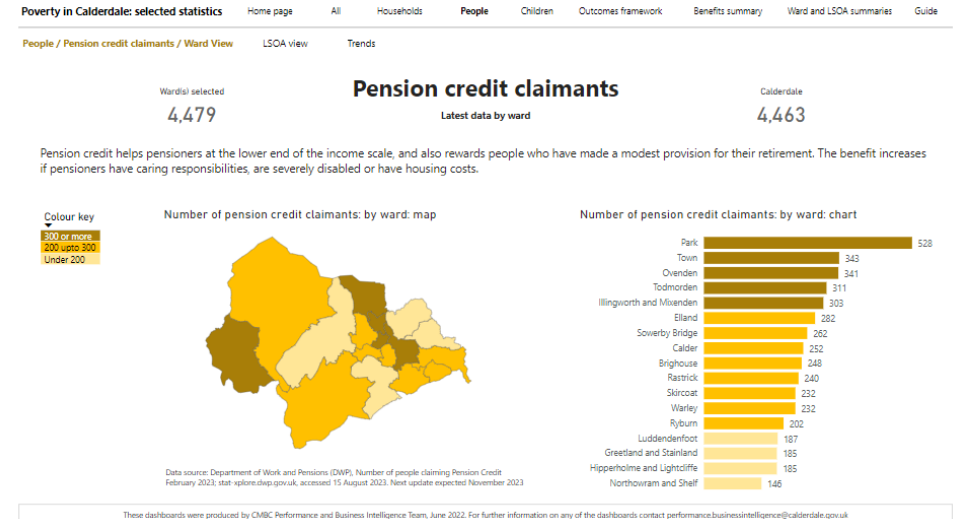
When you click on “Pension credit” on the “All statistics” dashboard, the first screen to come up will be “Pension credit claimants – latest data by ward”.

Tasks

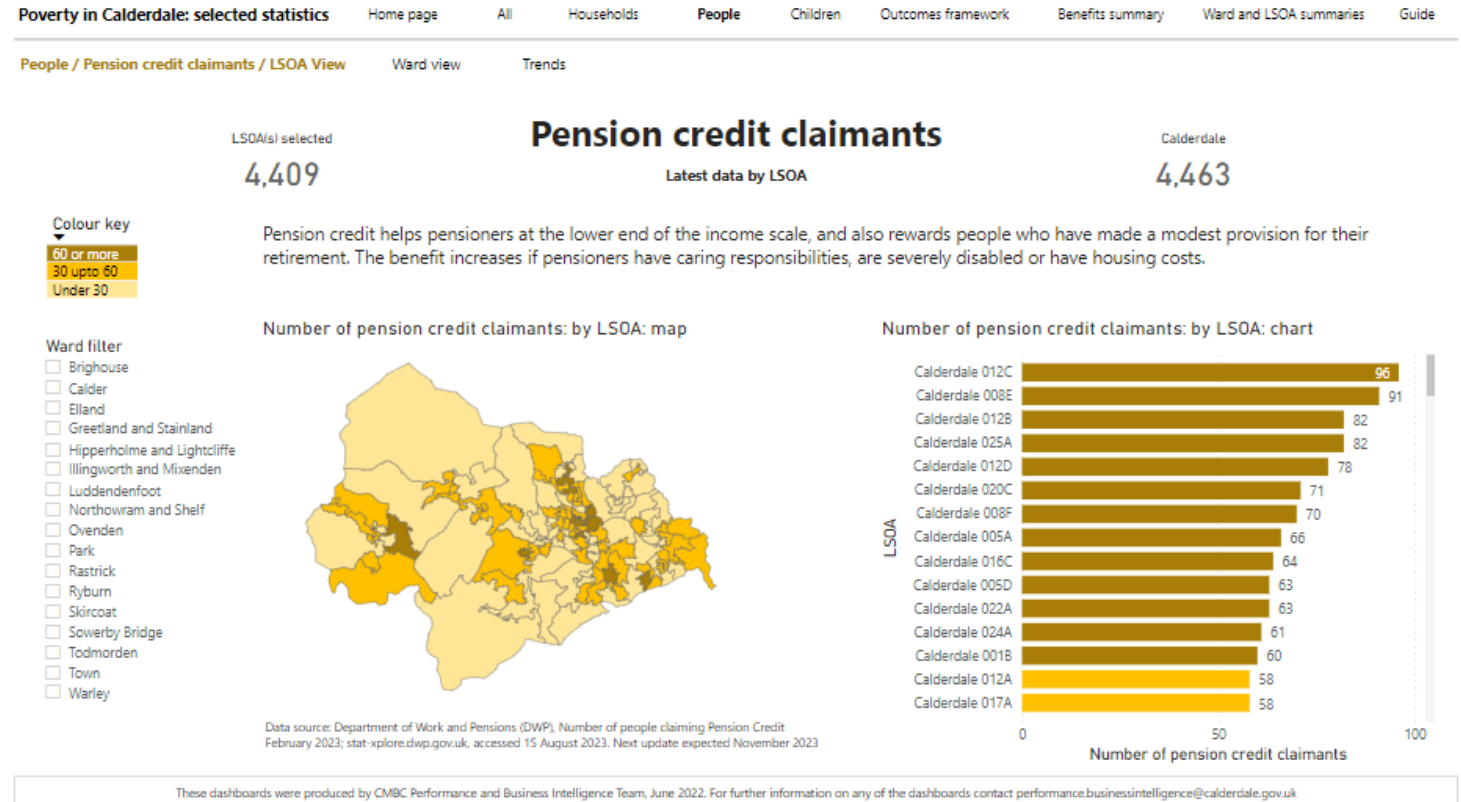
1. Select one or more of the wards listed in the chart. To select more than one press “Ctl click” for each ward. The map will change to reflect the wards you have clicked on.

Click on the wards you have selected to return the map to a full view of Calderdale.

2. Click on the  “focus mode” symbol in the corner of the map to enlarge it. Click on the “Back to report” button to return to the previous screen
3. Click on the “focus mode” symbol in the corner of the chart to enlarge it. Click on the “Back to report” button to return to the previous screen.
4. When you have completed the above tasks click on “LSOA view” in the Pension Credit tool bar.

When you click on “LSOA view” in the Pension credit tool bar, the screen “Pension credit claimants – latest data by LSOA” will appear.

Tasks

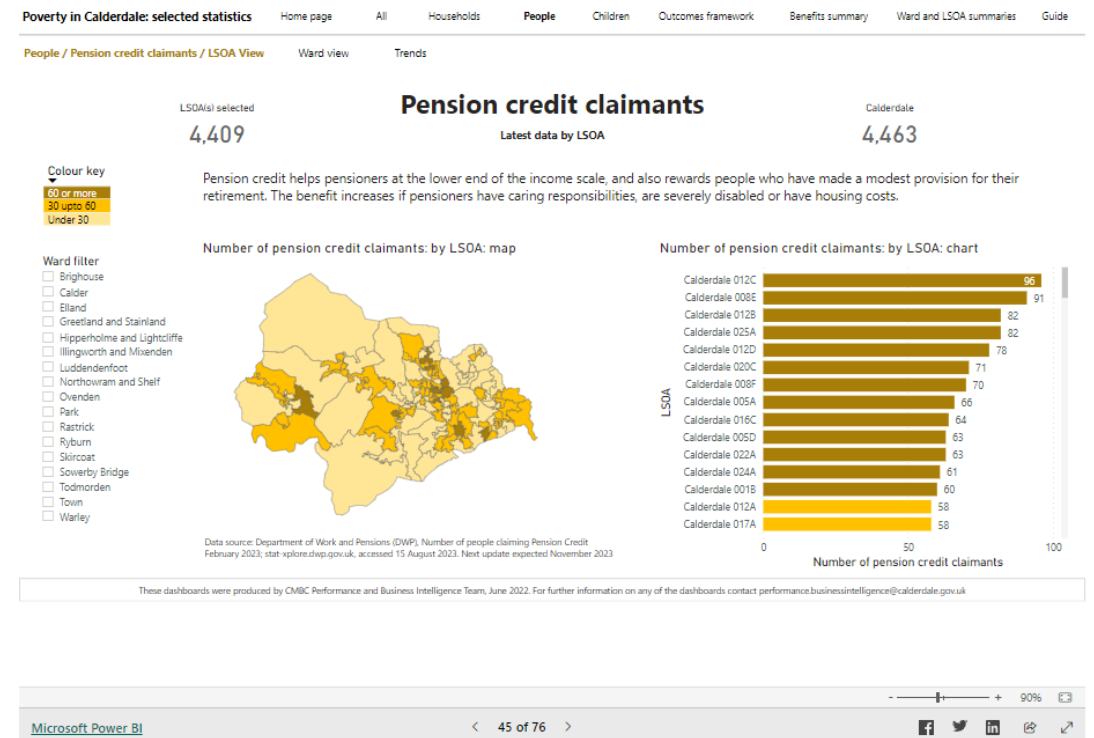
1. Select one or more wards from the ward filter.
 - To select one ward, click in the box next to the ward name. The box will go black when you have selected it.
 - To select more than one ward press the “Ctl” key in the bottom left of your keyboard and then click in the appropriate boxes for each of the wards you would like to select.

Black squares will appear next to each ward you have selected.

The map and chart will change to reflect the areas you have selected

- Click on the black squares to “deselect” them or the eraser symbol  to deselect all of them in one go.

2. When you have completed the above task click on “Trends” in the Pension credit tool bar.

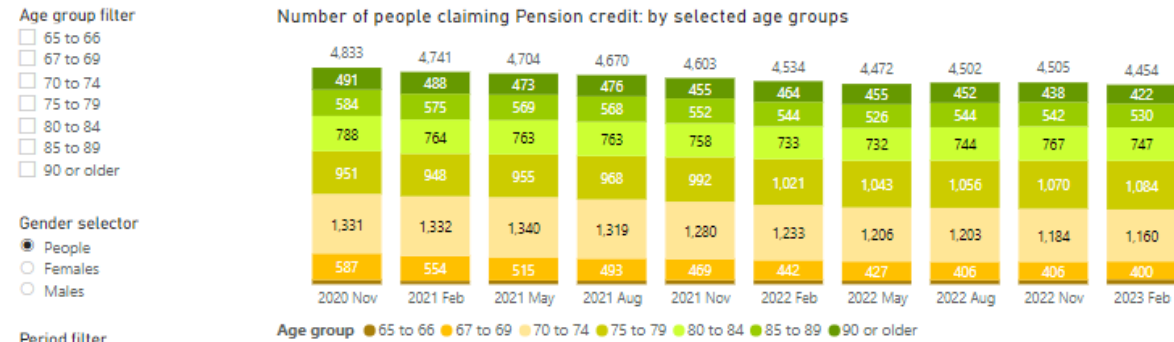


Example trends dashboard

Pension credit claimants: by selected age groups and gender

Results over time

Pension credit helps pensioners at the lower end of the income scale, and also rewards people who have made a modest provision for their retirement. The benefit increases if pensioners have caring responsibilities, are severely disabled or have housing costs. Pension credit can be claimed once you reach state pension age. The State Pension Age was 65 in November 2018 and 66 by October 2020. Use the filters below to select results by age group, gender and time period.

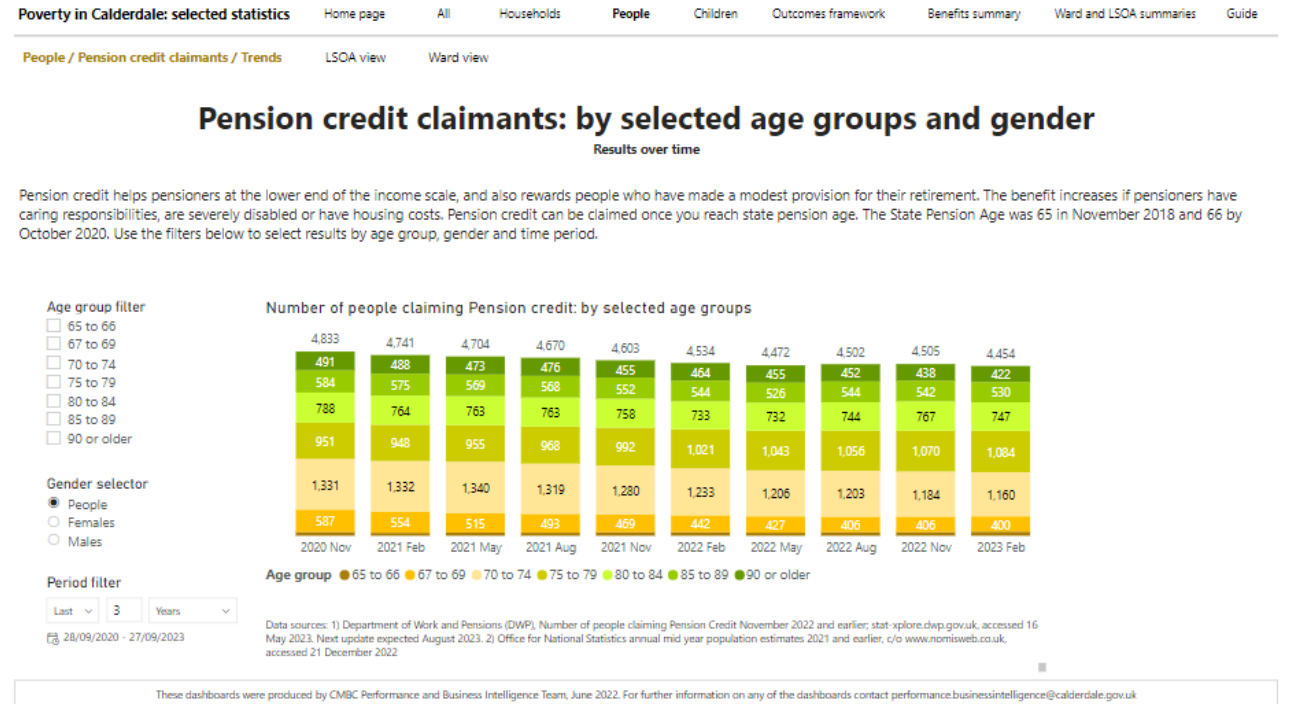

Example trends dashboard (continued)

When you click on “Trends” in the Pension credit tool bar, the screen “Pension credit claimants: by selected age groups and gender: results over time” will appear.

Tasks

1. Select one or more age groups from the age group filter.
2. Use the gender selector to view results for People, Males or Females
3. Use the period filter to change the period – eg 2 years, or 18 months.
4. When you are ready click on “All” in the top tool bar.
