



IoD 2025: Health deprivation and disability domain

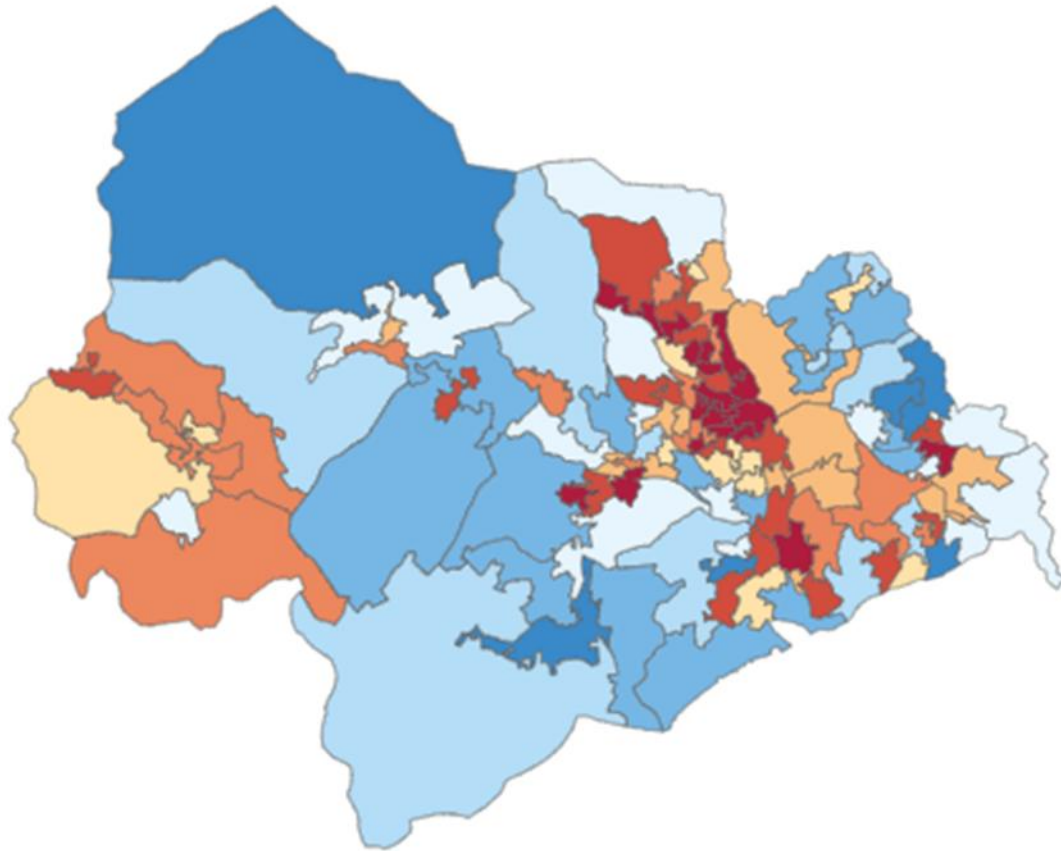
The **Health deprivation and disability domain** measures premature death and the impairment of quality of life by poor health. It considers both physical and mental health. The domain measures morbidity, disability and premature mortality but not aspects of behaviour or environment that may be predictive of future health deprivation. This table summarises the number of neighbourhoods in Calderdale that are within 30% most deprived in England for this domain.

The English Indices of Deprivation (IoD) use LSOAs to report statistics for neighbourhood areas. LSOA is short for lower-layer super output area. LSOAs typically include populations about 1,600 people.

There are 33,755 LSOAs in England of which 129 are in Calderdale.

IoD 2025: Health deprivation and disability domain Measures

- Comparative Illness and Disability Ratio: an age and sex standardised ratio of people receiving Disability Living Allowance (DLA), Employment and Support Allowance (ESA), Attendance Allowance (AA), Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit/Reduced Earnings Allowance/ Retirement Allowance, Incapacity Benefit (IB), Severe Disablement Allowance (SDA), Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and Universal Credit (UC) Health Caseload. DWP 2022/23
- Years of Potential Life Lost: an age and sex standardised rate of 'premature death', defined as death before the age of 75 from any cause. ONS 2018 to 2022
- Acute Morbidity: an age and sex standardised rate of hospital spells starting with an admission in an emergency and lasting more than one calendar day. HSCIC HES
- Mental health data
- Mental health sub-component 1: Suicide: a rate of deaths coded as intentional. ONS 2018 to 2022
- Mental health sub-component 2: Hospital admissions: a rate of hospital admissions related to mental health. Mental Health Service data set. 2021/22 to 2022/23
- Mental health sub-component 3: Prescribing data: a rate of patients prescribed pharmaceuticals for mental ill-health GP prescribing data. 2021/22 to 2022/23
- Mental health sub-component 4: Health benefits: the number of residents claiming Personal Independence Payments (PIP) and Disability Living Allowance (DLA) in disease groupings associated with mental health or behavioural disorders as a proportion of the total population aged 0-66. DWP 2022/23
