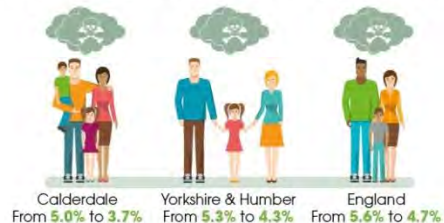

Empowering Communities

Calderdale's amazing kindness and resilience summed up perfectly by its vibrant culture of volunteering and community action. We see people of all ages and backgrounds doing things like to help each other, with a community spirit that is exceptional. With a thriving 800 voluntary organisations in the borough, there's been lots of volunteering opportunities in people's lifetimes.

On being the 2013 Calderdale regional winner of the most fantastic in history. But it also one of the best examples of Calderdale's incredible resilience. Over 400 volunteers formed themselves to support the auction, and many more helped and supported as individuals or part of groups organised by business, churches and temples.

The strong links created during and after the floods give Calderdale a great starting point to show how volunteering often, allowing them the benefit of local people to be one of the key challenges to be met in 2024. We know it's vital to do this, as having more volunteers would lead to a healthier, happier, more confident and resilient Calderdale, with less social isolation of the health that volunteering brings.

As three older people are able to volunteer now due to progress on their own and additional

We need to make people more volunteering... it's not just a people thing and often people work just to meet opportunities, especially when they are not of work or retired. Better provision is needed to place where people will see the opportunity. For example, most of the people who come to Calder or Thoresby are not registered as members. So the voluntary work they would be more likely to take on based on opportunity presented by their job or other work."

"We also need to increase volunteering and give people a real reason to make the effort, get out and participate. This could be things like working across areas such as mental health to benefit the first year membership for working a certain number of volunteer hours. Having that goal and allowing opportunities for a job well done to study improve."
